## UNIVERSITY CIRCLE: THE CULTURAL HUB OF CLEVELAND

Case Western Reserve’s campus is in the heart of **University Circle**, named the #1 arts district in the country by *USA Today*. Our neighborhood is home to more than 50 of the world’s finest cultural, medical, educational and social-service

**institutions**—all within one square mile. *The Cleveland Museum of Art*, *Cleveland Orchestra*, *Cleveland Museum of Natural History*, *Western Reserve Historical Society’s Cleveland History Center* and *Cleveland Botanical Garden* provide not only entertainment, but also academic collaborations that give our students ample opportunities for hands-on training. **Cleveland’s health corridor** is also a mainstay of the area, with *Cleveland Clinic*, *University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center* and the *Louis Stokes Cleveland VA Medical Center* as important partners with the university’s health sciences departments.

But University Circle’s offerings don’t end with museums and hospitals. You’ll find **dining options** from the sandwich shop/live-music venue *Cosmic Dave’s Rock Club* to the chic French bistro *L’Albatros*. We also have hangouts like *The Jolly Scholar* and *The Coffee House at University Circle*. The circle’s **park-like setting** also gives visitors a chance to enjoy green spaces on the Nord Family Greenway, Wade Oval or the art museum’s lagoon. ### 2 LITTLE ITALY

### 3 COVENTRY VILLAGE

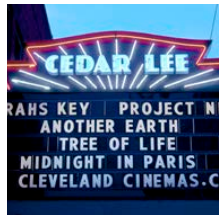

### 5 CEDAR-LEE

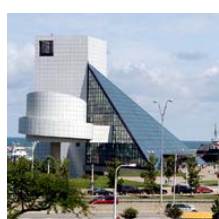

### 6 SHAKER SQUARE

At the intersection of Shaker Boulevard and Rapid Transit rail lines sits **the country’s second-oldest shopping district**. Shaker Square, three miles south of campus, offers everything from six screens at *Atlas Cinemas Shaker Square* to the mission-driven French dining experience (the subject of an Oscar-nominated film) at *EDWINS Leadership & Restaurant Institute*.



### 7 DOWNTOWN

The Case Western Reserve campus is just five miles east of downtown Cleveland, where more entertainment awaits. **Home to professional sports teams** the *Browns*, *Cavaliers*, *Guardians* (formerly the *Indians*) and *Monsters*, downtown also maintains **the legacy of Cleveland’s musical**

**roots** with *The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum* and popular concert venues that host international and local acts. The *Theater District* brings more performances to life, while favorites *East Fourth Street* and the *Warehouse District* offer trendy dining options, bars and a thriving nightlife.
